The Amber Collective came together in 1968, and since the 1970s this World-renowned filmmaking and photography group has explored the North of England, its changing communities and disappearing industrial landscapes.

Alongside Ken Loach, Amber are the last great (working) class warriors of British film. Based in Newcastle they make movies about a way of life that is rapidly disappearing, and one that is rarely represented on screen: drift miners, sea coalers, fishermen, a rope-worked railway, glassblowing and the engine room of the Shields Ferry, are just a few of the subjects they have tackled over the past 50 years.
